

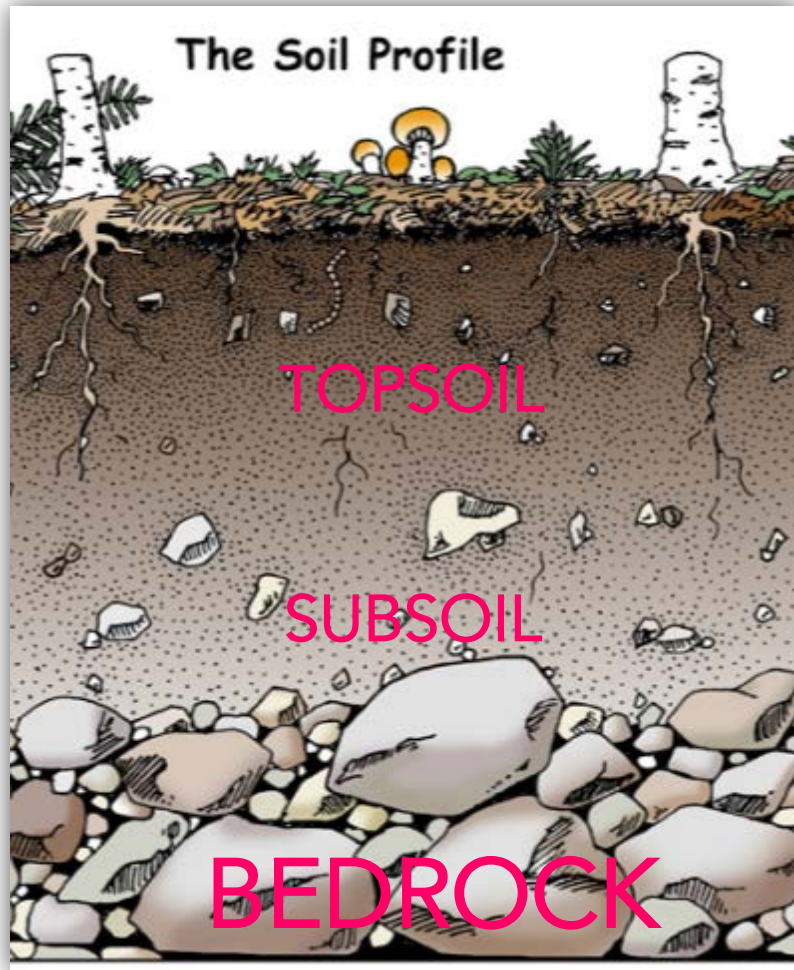

Community and philanthropy – a soil analogy

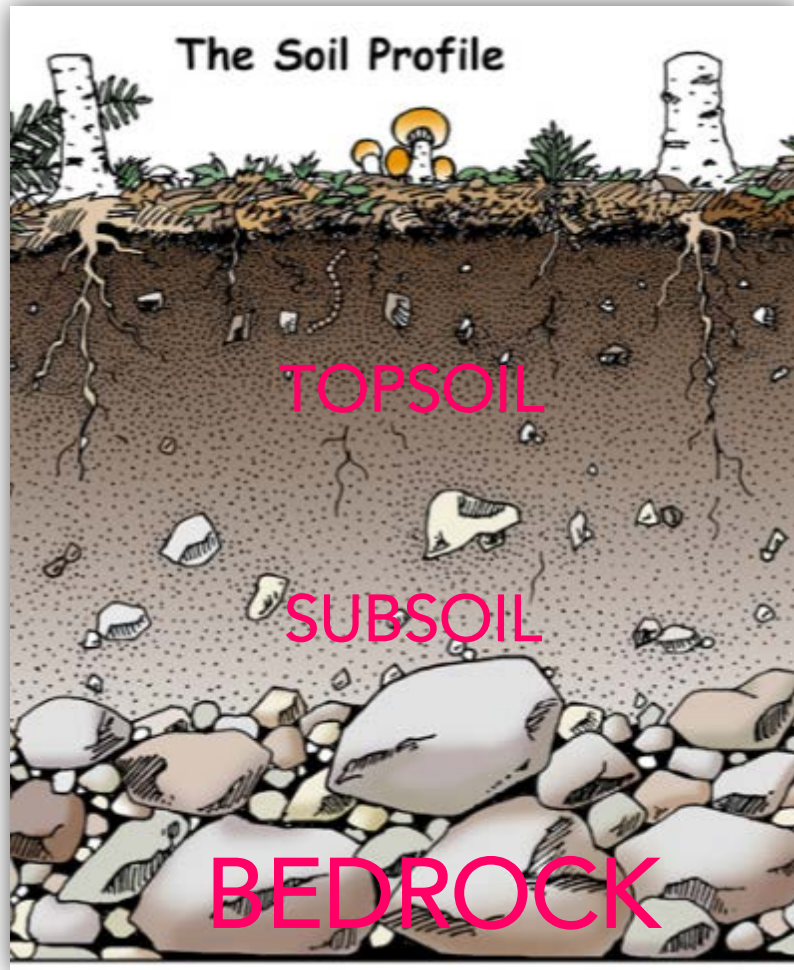


Vulnerable to weather and temporary

Community and philanthropy – a soil analogy

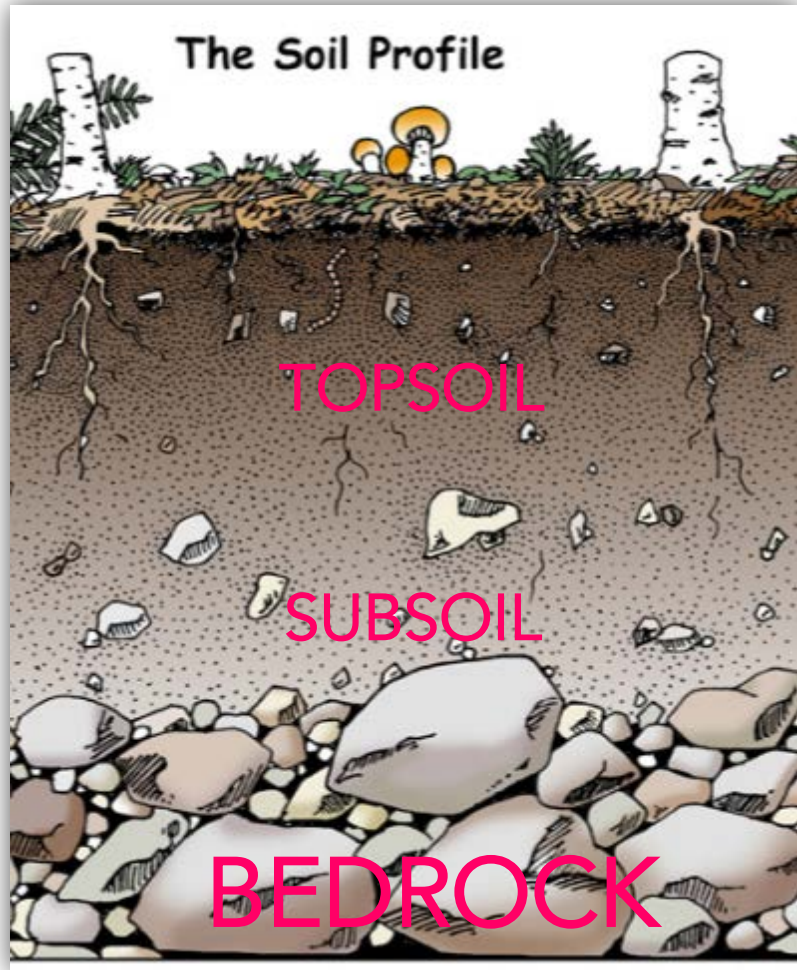


Unconnected services, temporary projects

How can philanthropy work with the bedrock?

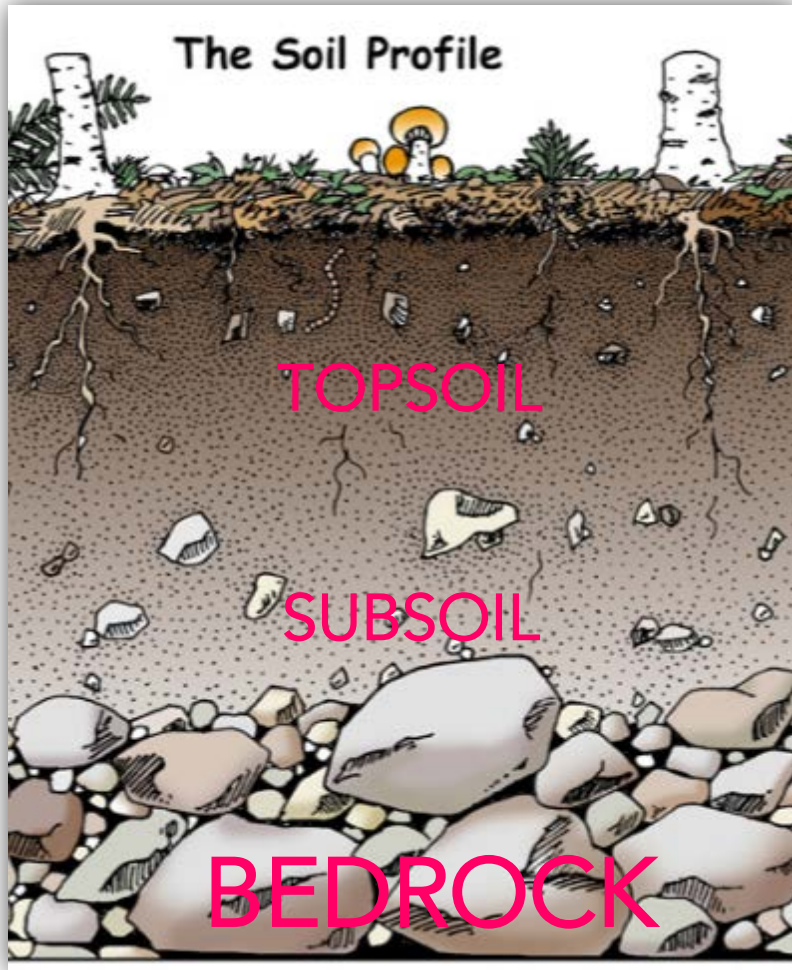


System of services

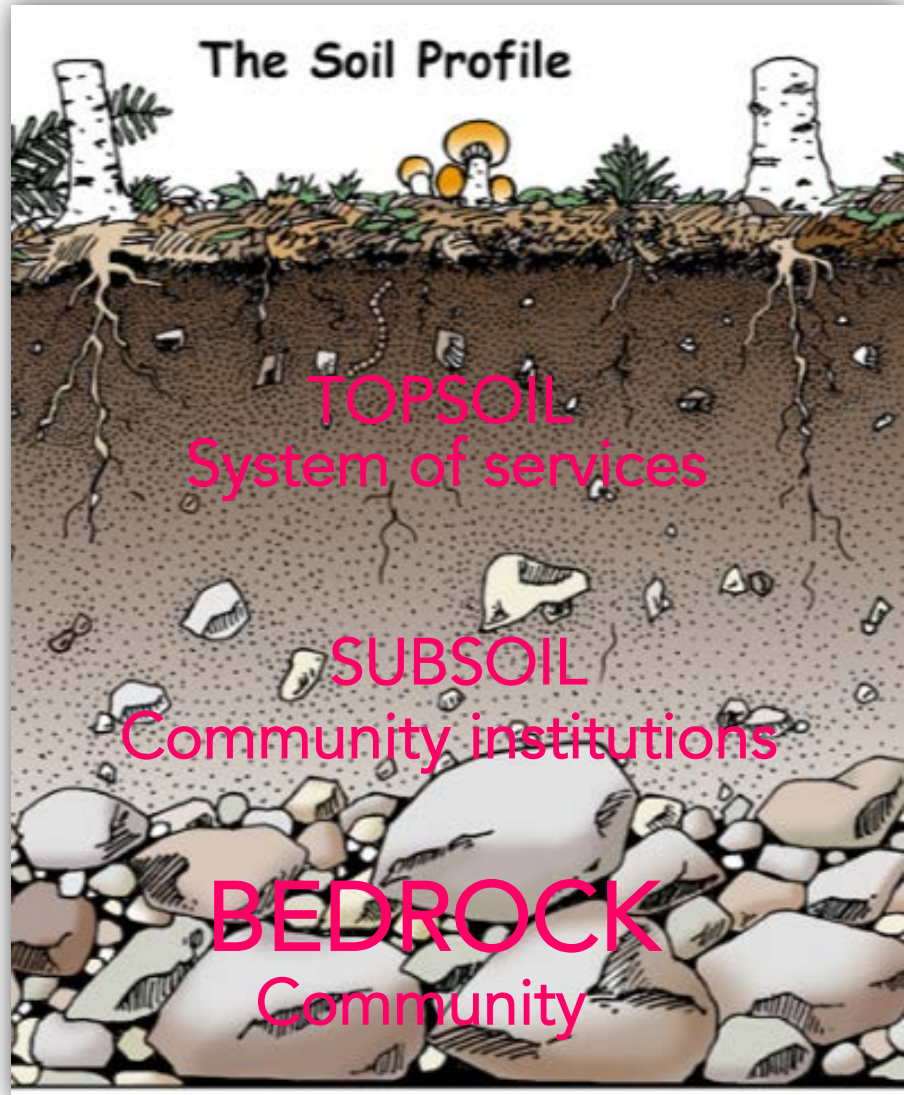

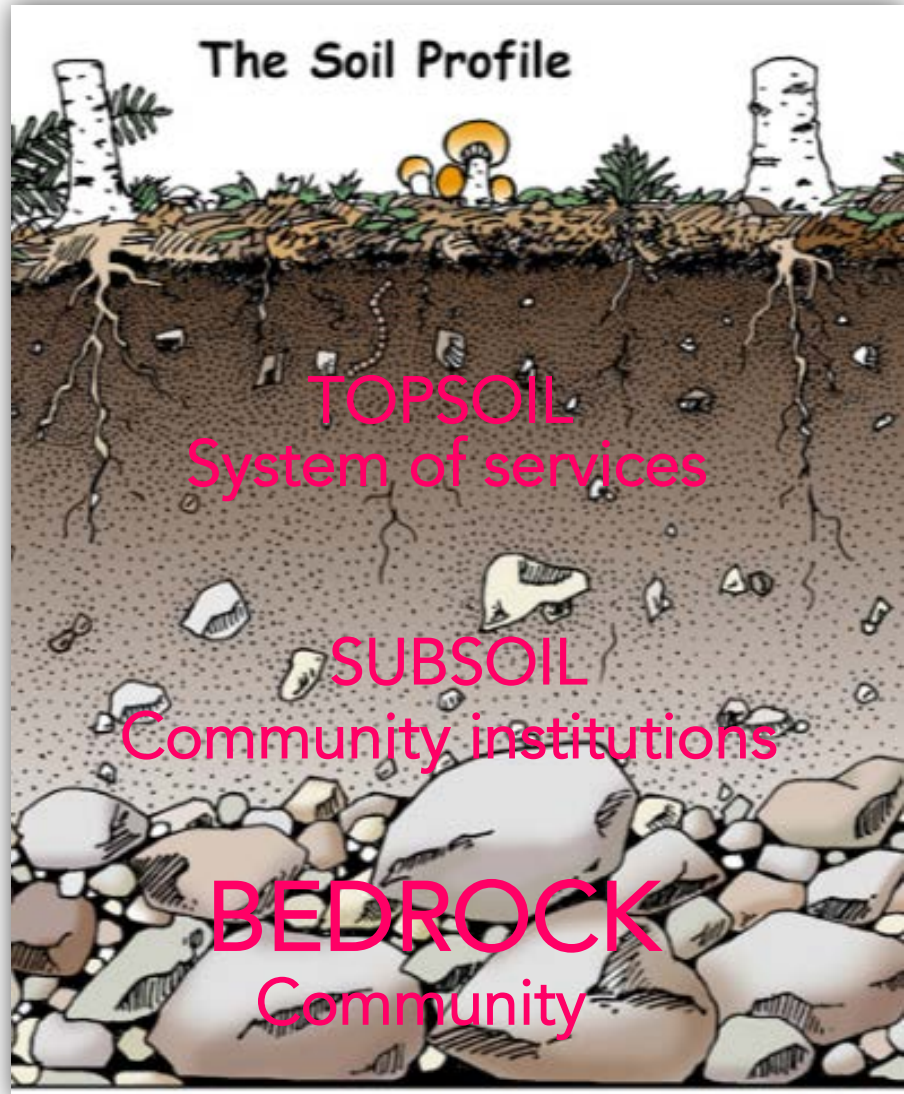
